Global

Relating to the whole world; worldwide.

International

Existing, occurring, or carried on between nations.

County

A county is a geographical region of a country; such as Derbyshire or Nottinghamshire.

Country

A nation with its own government, occupying a particular territory.

Continent

Any of the world's main continuous expanses of land

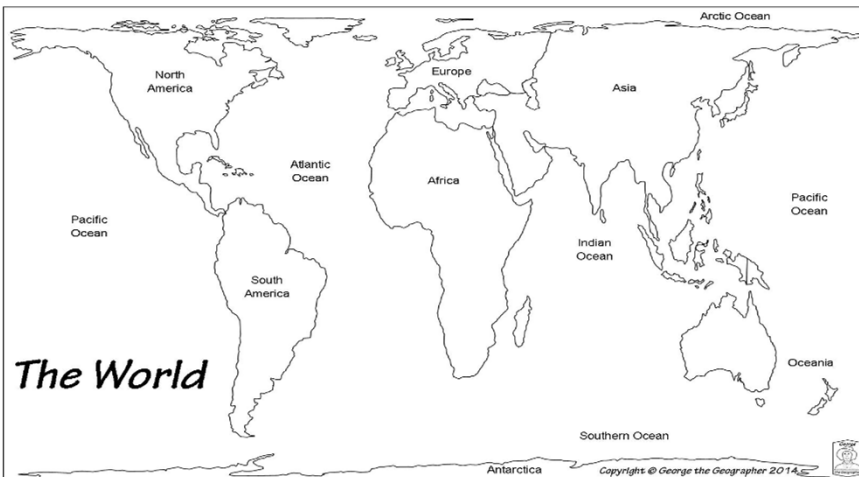
Ocean
