

Week 1

1. The Present Tense is used to express what is happening now.
2. Verbs are 'doing' words, such as *to run, to walk, to talk* and *to play*
3. When you look up a verb in a dictionary, you will find it in its infinitive form, which usually ends in -en e.g. spielen (to play)
4. You need to change the ending of the verb according to the pronoun you are using.
5. All regular verbs follow the same pattern:

pronoun	ending
singular (only one person)	
ich (I)	e
du (you)	st
er/sie/es (he/she/it)	t
plural (more than one person)	
wir (we)	en
ihr (you)	t
sie (they)	en
polite	
Sie (you)	en

Week 2:

6. Not all verbs follow the regular pattern - some are irregular in the du and er/sie/es forms - you will need to learn these ones separately...

7. When expressing you like to do something, you can say *Ich mag Tennis* - to express that you **do not like** to do something, you can say *Ich mag Tennis nicht*; the **nicht** comes **after the noun**...

Week 3:

8. Basic sentences word order =

pronoun/noun + verb + object/rest of sentence e.g. *Ich spiele Tennis*

9. Sometimes you can change the word order. This is called inversion. The verb always stays in second position: e.g. *Am Montag spiele ich Tennis*

Mag + noun

1. Ich **mag** Fußball = I like football
2. Ich **mag** Fußball nicht = I don't like football

Verb + gern

3. Ich **spiele** gern Fußball = I like playing football
4. Ich **spiele** nicht gern Fußball = I don't like playing football

5. **Möchtest du** Tennis spielen ?
Would you like to play tennis ?
6. **Möchtest du** ins Kino gehen ?
Would you like to go to the cinema ?
